Water Well - Somalia

In Somalia, water availability is naturally a climatic issue. Extremely low rainfall and much higher potential evaporation have caused acute shortages of water and food and destroyed crops and grazing lands. The little water available is contaminated, exposing an already weakened population to many water-borne diseases.

Lack of access to safe drinking water in an unhealthy environment is one of the major factors of poverty and children are particularly affected.

The only clean and safe drinking water is located only located deep underground and wells must be dug to access this water.

Dear Islamic Egyptian Society,

In order to combat water shortages and reduce associated diseases, Muslim Aid Australia conducts a Provision of Clean Water Campaign by constructing water wells, water reservoirs, and water storage tanks and pumps. The aim is to ensure that development work leads to tangible and sustained improvements in the lives of people in developing countries. This is implicit in the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs), which were adopted by 189 countries in 2000, and the Monterrey Consensus of 2002, which stressed the need to mobilize financial resources more efficiently.

Water is a basic human necessity and a vital natural resource for all aspects of life. Fast growing problems of water inevitably lead to disaster. In Somalia, water availability is naturally a climatic issue. Located in a very advantageous region bordering both the Indian Ocean and the Red Sea, Somalia geographically lies in the Horn of Africa, adjacent to the Arabian Peninsula. Extremely low rainfall and much higher potential evaporation have caused acute shortages of water and food and destroyed crops and grazing lands. Virtually all pastureland has disappeared and most water sources have dried up. The little water available is contaminated, exposing an already weakened population to many water-borne diseases.

To assist in providing storage of water for humans and livestock and making safe drinking water accessible all year round, as well as crop production during dry seasons, Muslim Aid Australia constructed water wells in areas in Somalia where water is scarce or virtually inaccessible. The implementation and construction of water wells in Somalia were directed by our local NGO partners who coordinated and supervised qualified voluntary organizations and persons with special plans and guidelines. At least 80 families or approx 420 individuals who could not access safe drinking water will now benefit from the water reservoir. The beneficiaries expressed their gratitude to the donors of Australia and prayed for their prosperity to the Almighty Allah.
